Goals and Visions for the HPPC and HIV Prevention Planning

(adopted by the HPPC in the 2004 HIV Prevention Plan)

Our vision is to create a healthier community by promoting:

- Health and wellness
- Linkages and coordination
- Prevention with positives and negatives
- Staying one step ahead
- Science + community values = success

With this we aim to reduce the number of new HIV infections.

Goals and Visions for the HPPC and HIV Prevention Planning

(adopted by the HPPC December 2006)

Our overarching principles are:

- to provide updated HIV education to all San Francisco residents, customizing its materials and approach so that they are culturally appropriate and available in multiple languages;
- address the needs of specific populations that are at highest risk for HIV transmission and/or acquisition; and
- document our successes and challenges in developing and implementing HIV prevention services

Goals and Visions for the HPPC and HIV Prevention Planning for 2007

- Continue to move prevention “upstream”
 - Increased focus on structural interventions
 - Explore feasibility of Safe Injection sites, etc.

- Continue to create innovative, cutting edge approaches to HIV Prevention
 - Taking risks is a necessary component of creative prevention
 - Prevention with Positives

- Make better use of data & evaluation to improve HIV prevention

Goals and Visions for the HPPC and HIV Prevention Planning for 2007

Setting priorities

- Continue to acknowledge cofactors
- Plan for new HIV prevention plan that describes how the HPPC will put its vision into practice
- Support the membership of HPPC and Parity, Inclusion, and Representation (PIR) by developing trainings and continuing education for all members
- Document our challenges and successes

2007 HPPC Committees

Points of Integration between Prevention and Care (POI)

This is a joint committee of the HIV Health Services Planning Council and the HIV Prevention Planning Council.

Substance Use Issues and Structural Solutions

This committee will explore issues related to substance use and HIV and make recommendations for structural and other solutions aimed at prevention of HIV in this regard.

HPPC Committees Continued

Show Me the Data! Getting Ready for SF's Next HIV Prevention Plan

This committee will kick off planning for the 2008/9 HIV Prevention Plan by tackling two key issues: (1) how the HPPC sets priorities for funding, and (2) assessing unmet HIV prevention needs.

Membership/Community Liaison Committee

This committee oversees and implements new member recruitment, application, selection, and orientation for the HPPC. This committee also ensures parity, inclusion, and representation on the Council.

HPPC Committees Continued

Steering Committee

The Steering Committee is the governing body of the HPPC, managing the day-to-day operations of the HPPC, including process issues and committee work. This committee makes decisions about Council priorities and makes recommendations about HIV prevention and HPPC process issues to the Council.
