



# Syringe Access Services are highly effective in preventing HIV and Hepatitis C in our community

“Studies show that comprehensive prevention and drug treatment programs, including needle exchange, have dramatically cut the number of new HIV infections among injecting drug users (IDUs). In fact, **HIV infections among IDUs have dropped from a peak of nearly 35,000 infections annually in the late 1980s to just 3,900 new infections in 2010.**” - CDC HIV Fact Sheet

The Syringe Access Collaborative (SAC) provides syringe access and disposal services through multiple community-based organizations in our city (see map). The key to SAC’s strength is each program’s expertise and cultural competency with different populations of people who inject drugs.

Syringe Access Services are rooted in the successful tradition of harm reduction, which begins with the notion of “meeting people where they are at” when it comes to their drug use. SAC programs are located in neighborhoods where drug users live and connect participants to additional health and wellness services that can address their individual needs. Research shows that this approach is the most effective way to stem the tide of new HIV and Hepatitis C infections and connect people to other crucial services, such as HIV/Hep C treatment and primary medical care.
