Chapter	Purpose
1: Epidemiologic Profile	To present the epidemiology of HIV and AIDS in San Francisco
2: Community assessment	To describe what is known about the needs of different San Francisco populations and the factors that affect their risk.
3: Priority Setting	To identify the highest priority populations and the highest priority issues that must be addressed in order to do effective prevention, and to recommend funding accordingly, from a planning perspective.
4: Strategies & Interventions	The purpose of this chapter is to provide organizations with the tools needed to design and implement HIV prevention programs. Additionally, this chapter describes how to create HIV prevention programs to implement one or more of the areas prioritized by the HPPC.
5: Evaluation	To provide an overview of San Francisco's approach to evaluation of HIV prevention efforts and to outline future plans for evaluation. This chapter is intended to help all who are involved in HIV to understand the perspective of the HPPC on the role of evaluation in combating HIV. The HPPC supports evaluation that is community-oriented, community-driven, collaborative, and inclusive.
